**Texas WWI Service Record Cards from the Texas Military Forces Museum.** Available from familysearch.org (free account required) – indexed, searchable. Includes most but not all Texas service records, but not records for soldiers who served through other states.

The collection also includes the service cards of Army nurses, but those records are not yet fully indexed so you have to click through the original documents to locate.
